A Forum for the Chinese Community in Queensland: 20 Years of QCF

Introduction

In the last forty years, the population of Chinese migrants and Chinese Australians settling in Queensland has increased substantially. During the same time, over forty community associations and organisations have been formed within different sectors of the Chinese community looking after the interests and welfare of their members. In spite of their varied objectives and activities, the majority of the Chinese community associations support the idea that there should be a body representing the Chinese community when important issues affecting the whole community arise and need to be addressed. Resources and energy can also be pooled and channelled effectively for activities and initiatives benefiting all members of the Chinese community.

Formation of QCF

The Council of Chinese Organisations of Queensland was first proposed in 1984 by several Chinese ethnic community leaders and an interim committee was set up as the preparatory group. This was in response to a nation-wide controversy on Asian immigration during the Hawke Labor Government.

The Council was renamed the Liaison Committee of Chinese Organisations of Queensland in 1987; and later as the Queensland Chinese Forum (the Forum, QCF) when it was formally constituted in 1994 with seven member associations (Cathay Community Association, Chinese Business and Professional Association Qld, Chinese Ethnic Broadcasting Association of Qld, Chinese Fraternity Association of Qld, Hong Kong Business & Professional Association of Qld, Qld Chinese Food and Beverage Hospitality Association, Taiwan Friendship Association Qld), and incorporated in January 1995.

Early Activities and Governance of QCF

In late 1996, in response to mounting public debate on multiculturalism and racial discrimination after the election of Pauline Hanson to the Federal Parliament, the Forum established a special Task Force to work out long term strategies for promoting racial harmony and social cohesion in Queensland and Australia.

A number of contacts with the Queensland and Federal governments were made to bring up the profile of QCF.

Today, the Forum represents its members on general matters and issues which are of mutual concern to the Chinese community in Queensland; whilst individual member associations retain full autonomy in the management of their own activities and affairs.

The general running of the Forum is governed by a Management Committee comprising of delegates from each of the member associations. Any decision is made by the majority in any meeting. An election is held every year when the Executive positions comprising President, Secretary and Treasurer are elected.

In order to avoid having one person from an organisation taking the President role for a long period of time, the Constitution makes restriction on the President's term of office.

Significant Milestone Activities

Establishment of other Chinese organisations

4.1.1Lions Club of Brisbane Chinese 1996

The Lions Club of Brisbane Chinese was chartered in 1996. Mr Peter Low OAM (QCF Founding President, Honorary President) was instrumental in the establishment of this Club.

4.1.2Chinese Museum of Queensland 2004

The idea of establishing such a museum was brought up by members of QCF in 2000, and recorded in the minutes of the General Meeting of QCF held on 7 November 2000. A Steering Committee was formed in October 2003, and the association Chinese Museum of Queensland Inc was formally incorporated in November 2004.

4.1.3 Chinese Community Crime Prevention Consultative Committee 2007

In June 2006 QCF submitted a letter to the Minister for Police to seek support to establish a Chinese Community Crime Prevention Consultative Committee. After two preparatory meetings between QCF and the Queensland Police Service (QPS) in August and September 2006, the Committee's Inaugural Meeting was held on 23 November 2006, attended by eight representatives from QCF and sixteen representatives from QPS. The Committee was subsequently formally launched by the Premier Peter Beattie on 20 February 2007, during the Premier's Chinese New Year Reception at the State Parliament.

Hosting of Public Conferences & Seminars

4.2.1 QCF Conference 2007

One of the objectives actively pursued by QCF is "to provide a forum for delegates from Chinese organisations in Queensland to discuss and act on matters of domestic importance affecting the Chinese community and to facilitate communication and co-operation amongst Chinese organisations in Queensland". The first QCF conference entitled "Australian Chinese, Australian Politics" held in State Parliament Annexe was an initiative to achieve this objective. The full day conference was conducted on Sunday 11 March 2007. It was opened by the Acting Speaker of Parliament and attended by some 140 people, including eleven keynote speakers.

3rd QCF Conference 2012

The prime objectives of this conference were to understand Confucianism; to explore how Confucianism has evolved since 2,500 years ago; to shed light on the influence of Confucianism on current Chinese Australians in particular the ability to take up public roles; to examine the influence in Education, Technology, Business and Politics and; to understand the perceptions of young Chinese regarding Confucianism. The full day conference was held on Sunday 18 November 2012 in the Parliament House Annexe, Brisbane. It was attended by some 100 people, including five keynote speakers who presented their views on the relevant issues.

2nd QCF Conference 2009

A Virtual Exhibition of the 'History of Chinese Settlement in Queensland' was held on Saturday 24 October 2009 in the Parliament House Annexe, Brisbane. The objective was to celebrate 160 years of the Chinese settlement in Queensland, as part of the Q150 Celebrations. The program for the conference at State Parliament consisted of two main parts: viewing of a 6-part video documentary produced by the project team and lectures by keynote speakers. The conference was attended by over 250 guests from various sectors of the Queensland community.



5.2.1 Commemorative Bell 2007

To recognise the contribution of Australian Service personnel of Chinese heritage in Australia's past armed conflicts, QCF commenced a project establishing a commemorative memorial for those Chinese who fought for Australia during the World Wars. In July 2004 the Cathay Community Association, a member of QCF, with the support of the QCF and New Guinea Volunteer Rifles and Papua New Guinea Volunteer Rifles Association submitted to the Commonwealth Department of Veterans' Affairs for a Community War Memorial grant under the 'Saluting Their Service' Grants. The Brisbane City Council also committed to pay for the installation of a Commemorative Bell, as well as its ongoing maintenance. QCF subsequently commissioned a foundry in China to cast a commemorative bronze bell. The official launch of the Commemorative Bell on Saturay10 March 2007 was organised by QCF in cooperation with the Brisbane City Council and Australian Defence Forces. The Bell's plaque was unveiled by the then Lord Mayor Campbell Newman in the presence of senior representatives of the Australian Defence Forces.



To fulfil the objective of "Promotion and Advancement of Chinese Culture and Multiculturalism in Australia", QCF organised functions such as celebrations of Chinese New Year and Moon Festival, celebration at Parliament House after the new State Government sworn in, as well as assisted the State Government with the annual Premier's Chinese New Year Reception at the State Parliament.

Response to Racist Views and Government Policy

In November 1996, QCF and the Vietnamese community in Queensland co-hosted a dinner seminar to denounce the racist views of Pauline Hanson. QCF then participated in a protest march in Ipswich to voice our concerns.

In 2013, the government proposed to change the Racial Discrimination Act, Section 18 C in particular. QCF collectively provided a response objecting to such changes. This was the first direct response in relation to government policy; and QCF will endeavour to take part, within our limited resources, to express our views on issues that are of common interests to our members in the future.



Radio 4EB commenced broadcasting from 249 Montague Road, West End in December 1979 with a frequency of 1485 AM. The Chinese community was invited to join the 4EB family in 1980. Professor Leung Sun (Ming) Leung was the Founding President of the Chinese Ethnic Broadcasting Association of Queensland (4EB Chinese Group). The Chinese Group comprises of both the Cantonese and Mandarin programs on 4EB over the last 34 years.

In 1985 the State Government gave 4EB a block of land at Kangaroo Point and a twostorey purpose-built studio became the new home of Radio 4EB until today. The building fund was largely raised through many years of radiothon and other activities run by the dedicated volunteers.

We are now broadcasting on FM98.1, as well as through digital radio and internet. The Chinese programs include:

4EB民族電台於1979年十二月首播。華人社區於1980獲邀加入4EB的大家庭,當時的廣播 頻道是1485AM,台址是249 Montague Road, West End。那時華語組的聯絡人是梁亮新 教授,也就是過去三十四年統籌廣東話及國語廣播的「昆士蘭華語廣播協會」(4EB中文組) 創會會長。州政府於1985年撥出Kangaroo Point空地讓電台興建一座完全屬於自己的樓 房, 更進一步地發展這個民族廣播事業。

4EB中文組分別在1995、2005及2010年出版了15、25及30周年紀念特刊,標誌了一段段 的廣播里程。

2010年後,會長分別由Polly Ma, Robert Zee徐月興,和現今的Elsa Shuay帥如珊擔任,不變 的是廣播是一種有聲語言的創作,以語言爲核心,包括語言動機(為什麼要播報)、語言理解 (報導的內容)、語言發出(廣播的含義)、語言目的(聲音的傳達)。播音員的創作通過聲音體 現,爲表達内容而服務。每一個廣播人駕馭自己的聲音,不急不徐,字音輕彈,如珠如流,聲 隨情動。把文字稿件轉化爲有聲語言,這其中隱含著聽覺形式的構思和傳達,讓聽眾有身 歷其境、情景再現之使命。隨著新型態的節目發展,中文組在數位(碼)頻道(Digital)這一塊 領域也做的有聲有色,讓廣播節目不受雜訊(noise)的干擾,同時更有制度的程式化。4EB 以外景直播方式和聽眾做更進一步的互動.由「傳統」到「數位」,

A Steering Committee to establish a Chinese Museum in Queensland was formed in October 2003. The chairperson of the Steering Committee was Mr. Peter Low OAM, and Vice Chairperson was Ms Jeannie Mok. The project has the support of the Brisbane City Council.

The association Chinese Museum of Queensland (CMoQ), Inc was formally incorporated on 26 November 2004.

The objectives of CMoQ are:

- 1. To operate a museum promoting an appreciation of Chinese artifacts and culture, and the role and contributions of the Chinese in Queensland in particular and Australia in general.
- 2. To develop partnerships with other museums and historical and heritage organizations.
- **3.** To foster an understanding and appreciation of the history of the Chinese in Queensland in particular and Australia in general.
- **4.** To do all such things as are conducive or incidental to the aims and objects of the Chinese Museum.

Since its establishment, CMoQ executives has been actively looking for a suitable premises, with little success to date. Before a permanent home for the Museum can be found, correspondence to the CMoQ is via P.O. Box 8207, Sunnybank 4109.

In 2006, a Brisbane City Council (BCC) grant was awarded to CMoQ as a seeding support to to conduct community awareness programs for the long term viability of the Museum, and to

In October 2009, CMoQ co-hosted a conference with the QCF in the Premiers' & Speakers' Halls, Parliament House Annex, Brisbane to commemorate 160 year of Chinese settlement in Qld and 150 year of the State of Qld. It was supported by the Q150 Community Funding Program, with the resulting production of a 6-part video documentary. A lot of material produced in the project can be used as part of the collections for the Museum.

With the current financial situation, there is little success of obtaining the government, whether local, state or federal to provide funding for the construction of a permanent museum premise. The prospect of getting major commercial sponsorship is also slim. A "virtual" Chinese Museum is the more viable option.

The Virtual Chinese Museum program includes the following components:

- 1. The development of a permanent and professional website for the Chinese Museum of Qld.
- 2. Public relations and marketing campaign for CMoQ.
- 3. The development and collection of historical articles and artifacts for the virtual museum.

The website "cmoq.org.au" was launched on 13 February 2011.

From late 20013 CMoQ worked with the University of the Sunshine Coast to obtain more historical material on Chinese settlement in Queensland from late 2013. These information still have to be uploaded onto our website.

The Gold Coast Chinese Club Inc (GCC) is a not for profit organisation that was formed in 1984 to promote Chinese Culture and Dragon boating. The club welcomes new settlers who move to the Gold Coast and help to foster international friendships with China and other countries.

The club has successfully run the Gold Coast Dragon Boat regatta for the past 27 years. The club president at the time Mr Ted Fong and Dr Mark Lee established the first GCC Club dragon boat team in 1987. From this team evolved the majority of dragon boat teams in Queensland.

In 2012, it was the first time that the regatta was staged at the Southport Broadwater Parklands. The regatta has also been held in conjunction with the Chinese Festival Gala. This has allowed the Chinese Club to showcase Chinese culture to the community.

Multicultural Community Centre (MCC) was established in 1989 in Chinatown by the International City Church, to meet the needs of Brisbane's culturally and linguistically diverse (CALD) community in Fortitude Valley and the wider Brisbane community. MCC was formally incorporated in 1996 as a charitable organisation assisting migrants, refugees, the disadvantaged, the poor, disabled and the elderly. From 1999 – 2013, MCC's premises were in Ann Street, Fortitude Valley, with a training centre in Newstead, opened by the Premier Anna Bligh in April 2010. In October 2013, MCC moved into the new Diverciti Centre, opened by Deputy Minister of Multiculturalism Robert Cavallucci MP.

MCC is actively involved in combating any forms of racism, acting as an advocate / liaison body; actively promoting multiculturalism and cultural maintenance of traditions, language, and customs. It has worked with the 'Aussie Battlers' (disadvantaged by poor English knowledge, lack of schooling), unemployed migrants, migrant women who lack a 'voice' due to cultural prejudices and greatly disadvantaged refugees.

MCC's Key Invitation

A key strategy is to get CALD migrants and refugees into the workforce and integrated into mainstream society; achieved through government funded courses including Certificate III in Aged Care / Child Care; Cert II Kitchen Operations, Cert II in Assets Maintenance, First Aid / CPR etc with grants from the Department of Multicultural Affairs, Brisbane City Council and private enterprises.

MCC has also started a 'Migrant One Stop Shop' - where newly arrived migrants are taught Life Skills and Job Preparation. Refugee students in state / high schools are taught leadership skills and nutrition / health. MCC runs Work Placement Projects where unemployed individuals receive wages, acquire skills, Australian qualifications and work experience. The Department of Immigration and Citizenship has supported MCC work with refugees through Settlement Grants Program funding; while the Department of Education and Employment (DETE) provides Community Education funding.

- MCC officers working with young CALD children / state school students
- Notable employment outcomes include Hospitality students gaining apprenticeships and starting their own restaurants; with Asset Maintenance graduates starting their own cleaning businesses
- MCC has been responsible for the publication of multicultural resources like the "Multicultural Directory" and "A Guide to Living in Brisbane"
- MCC has assisted CALD people needing emergency accommodation
- MCC has partnered with the Asian Pacific Institute to run a variety of training and employment programs.
- Responding to natural disasters by sending Green Army teams to clear up flood-ravaged parks; and fundraising for victims of international crises
- Volunteer Director Jeannie Mok OAM, MCC has acted as a voice of multicultural Australia; while influencing some Queensland public policies

At MCC, staff and volunteers live and breathe our maxim - "Transforming lives and changing destinies".

The Association was formed in response to a call by the then Prime Minister of Singapore, Mr Goh Chok Tong, who during his visit in September of 1994, had urged Singaporeans and former Singaporeans residing in Queensland to help promote close trade and business ties between Singapore and Australia.

Given the limitations of a state-focussed Association, it became necessary in 2007 to adopt a more strategic approach to address business issues and relationships on a country-to-country basis, hence the formation of the SBCA on 13th August 2007.

Ever since the announcement of the 5th World Congress of Zhongshan Society to be held in Sydney in 2004, a group of Zhongshan friends in Brisbane were keen to establish a Zhongshan Society Queensland Branch. The first ad hoc committee meeting was held on the 11th January 2004 at the Sun Fay Seafood Restaurant where the idea of a Zhongshan Society was formed. Shortly after this meeting Zhongshan Society Queensland Inc. (ZSS-Qld) was formally registered and established with its inaugural President Mr Dennis Fung.

ZSS-Qld has been greatly supportive of the Biennial Zhangshan World Congress since 2004. A large delegation of members and friends attended the Congress in Macau, Canada and Malaysia. These events provide great opportunities for linking up with our countrymen and their allied members from all over the world and have left with many fond memories.

One of the highlights deserving a special mention is the Macau World Congress. Many overseas delegates travelled to Zhongshan visiting relatives and friends, some returning to their respective home villages for the first time, others were finding their roots. Zhongshan City put on a warm and excellent reception. We were impressed and overwhelmed by the rapid pace of development happening back in our home city.

A few years ago ZSS-Qld was affiliated with the Queensland Chinese Forum. This has provided a platform and further opportunities for linkages with other Asian/ Chinese associations. Noticeably is our interaction with the Gold Coast Chinese Club mainly via its President Mr Tat Yin Fong who was also our ZSS-Qld Past President and Lifetime Honorary President. We always had funs at the Annual Dragon Boat Race under the leadership of Mr Fong. Last year we proposed to the Gold Coast Chinese Club and the Dragon Boat Association to hold a Table Tennis challenge between Gold Coast and Brisbane as one of the cultural events during the Dragon Boat Race event. To their credit, the Gold Coast team won the inaugural table tennis challenge by a narrow margin.

Our society is proud in the organization of non-profit tours that are open to both members and their friends. This is a great way to spend time with your countrymen and make new friends. Other cultural and social activities include special Chinese Festival celebration, contribution to Zhongshan Magazine in China, and supply of historical items to the Zhongshan Chinese Museum.






